

Science

Animals: Movement and nutrition

We will be studying the human skeleton. The children will identify key bones and explore how muscle changes result in movement.

The children will learn about how the body uses energy, what constitutes a balanced diet in humans and how research contributes to nutritionist expertise.

Computing

We will be introducing children to the concept of networks, learning how devices communicate. We will be identifying components, learning how information is shared and exploring examples of real-world networks.

Art & Design / Design and Technology

Abstract shape and space

We will be exploring how shapes and negative spaces can be represented by three dimensional forms.

The children will be manipulating a range of materials, learning ways to join and create free-standing structures inspired by the work of Anthony Caro.

We will be using these skills when constructing castles in term two.
