### You may want to consider doing the following **English** activities with your child:

- <https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/> Oxford Owl have free online reading books. Please register with them to access reading books at home. If you need more help with this please email us and we can advise you with it. You can use these books to get your child to practise reading for ten minutes every day. Remember to choose books that are the same colour band that your child was reading at school.
- Phonics: Revise all the ways we can write letters that make the sound 'ay'. Try <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/aiAltSpellings.html> or *Alphablocks Series 4 Name*. You could go on a word hunt in a book for words with an ay sound. (ai a-e ay ey a)
- Write a story about an imaginary pet. Or you could write about a real pet and some of the things they do. Try to use capital letters and full stops for all your sentences.

### You may want to consider doing the following **Maths** activities with your child:

- The Year One children need to learn about position words. E.g. *above, below, under, over, through, next to, in front behind, inside, outside, left, right*. Please plan an Easter treasure hunt that uses these words. You could make a map to help the children find the treasure. You could then ask the children to make their own treasure hunt and map.
- Keep practising counting to 100 forwards and **backwards**. If your child can do this then try starting on a random number. They then need to count in 2's, 5's and 10's to 100. Try Youtube for songs to help with this. Lots of the children like Jack Hartman count and exercise songs.

### You may want to consider doing the following **Topic** activities with your child:

- We thought an Easter Art week would be fun.
- Make a poster for your window to cheer up other people.
- Make Easter cards for friends and family.
- Have a go at egg decorating and make an Easter Tree. Use long twigs you might have collected from a walk if you don't have a garden. Make decorations to hang on your tree.
- Try making an Easter bonnet hat with things you can find around the house.
- We would love to see your photos!

### **Outdoor Learning opportunities:**

- If you are lucky enough to have a garden you could have a go at making an Easter wreath with natural materials from outside.
- Go on a Spring flower walk. Count how many different flowers you can find. Can you take a photo, then draw them and find out their names. Maybe label your drawings with the parts of the flower eg flower head, stem or stalk, roots etc

### **Ideas for keeping fit and healthy:**

- Play a game of musical bumps.
- How long can you hold the plank for? Have a competition with your family, who can hold it for the longest? Can you improve your score over the course of the week?
