

Davington Weekly Overview YEAR R

This week's overarching question or theme:

How do people celebrate Easter?

Week beginning: 6/4/20 Teachers: Miss Morgan and Miss Kennett

You may want to consider doing the following English activities with your child:

- Revise all the sounds we have learnt (see video from last week). (www.phonicsplay.co.uk is a great resource for this if you can access it)
- Revise the tricky words learnt (I, no, go, to, the, was, be, she, me, he, we, they, all, are, you).
- Make an Easter card to send to a friend/family member. Encourage your child to use the phonics they know-do not worry if it says 'To ____ hapee eesta luv from ____ 'as long as it is phonetically readable.
- Read some books and see which sounds/tricky words the children can spot that they have learnt.
- Design an Easter Egg. Ask your child to write a sentence to describe what's in it.

You may want to consider doing the following Maths activities with your child:

- If you have different Easter eggs in your house, ask your child to order them in order of size and in order of weight. If you have balance scales/a ruler, they could check their answers afterwards.
- Draw some different Easter eggs and set up a shop. Give each egg a price between 1p and 14p. Take turns being the shopkeeper/customer.
- Hide Easter eggs and give your child clues using the language of 'behind, next to, between, underneath, above' etc. Can they do the same for you and use those words?
- Make a picture using circles, triangles, rectangles and squares. Can your child name each one?

You may want to consider doing the following Topic activities with your child:

- Draw or paint an Easter picture. This could be using the story as a prompt. Alternatively it could show flowers, Easter eggs or the Easter bunny. You could use wax resist to make patterns on the egg, or to show Jesus in Heaven.
- Create an Easter garden. The children could use a plant pot as the tomb with a stone to cover the entrance. Add a cross and some flowers to decorate.
- Make and decorate an Easter basket or bonnet using recyclable materials in the home.

Outdoor Learning opportunities:

- Go on a 3D shape hunt around your house/garden/on a walk. Can your child find spheres, cones, cylinders, pyramid, cubes and cuboids?
- Find a flower and look at the different parts of it. Can the children identify the leaves, petals, stem and roots? Talk about the things a flower needs to survive.
- Go on a walk and look for signs of spring. We have spoken to the children about buds. Can they spot any on the trees? Are there any baby animals around?

Ideas for keeping fit and healthy:

- Play a game of musical bumps.
- How long can you hold the plank for? Have a competition with your family, who can hold it for the longest? Can you improve your score over the course of the week?
