### LISTEN - Edvard Grieg - In the Hall of the Mountain King from 'Peer Gynt'

Grieg originally wrote this music to go with a play by the author Ibsen. It took him quite a long time to write the original but he later extended parts of the tunes he'd written for the theatre to make a "Suite" of pieces that could be played at concerts.




The music from Peer Gynt is often used on TV. Have you heard it before?



## ♪ Have a go

This week's "Have a go" is called Rhythm

Rhythm gives you a wider selection of rhythm instruments.

Use the arrows at the edges of the frame to switch between pages of rhythm sets. When you switch look carefully at the number of vertical lines on each score. These represent the beats. One pattern has 3 beats, another 4 and the last has 5 beats in each pattern. Listen to the pod to find out how these sound different.

Once you've chosen your instruments see how interesting you can make your rhythmic patterns. If you have another instrument you can jam along with your patterns. You can hear what I did on the pod.

Make a note of you pattern so that you can recreate it next week...

## ♪ ... and rest!

This week's relaxing music is by the French composer Debussy (1862 - 1918). It's called "Rêverie".
