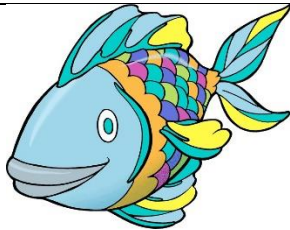

Using nouns.

What is a noun?	A noun is the name for a word that is a <u>thing</u> . Nouns can be objects, people's names or the names of places. A thing is something that you can see or hold. If the noun is a place or a person's name it always starts with a capital letter.
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Examples of nouns:	tree	bird	Faversham
	tinsel	friend	Merlin
	snow	robin	London
	leaf	dragon	Europe
